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THE BRITISH SCHOOL OF OSTEOPATHY

"physical examination in medical diagnosis by pressure of the hand or fingers to the surface of the body especially to determine the condition (as of size or consistency) of an underlying part or organ" (Merriam-Webster)

historically especialnic palpatory findings were described using the following terms:-

abnormal hardness, bogginess or ropiness (Fryer et al 2004) now simply 'intervertebral dysfunction' Fryer and Johnson (2005)
