What is a Professional Doctorate?


- Research Degree that focuses on Professional Practice
 - Bachelor Master Doctor (teacher/leader)
 - Differences from Doctor of Philosophy (PhD)
 - Focus on practice rather than area of knowledge (more complex)
 - Entails teaching as well as research

Prof.D.(Ost)

- Two broad aims
 - 1. To promote practice-based research to extend the knowledge and skill base of osteopathy
 - To explore a range of issues that are challenging to osteopathy:
 - ✓ Osteopathic identity in a multi-professional world
 - ✓ Deep understanding of different flavours of osteopathy
 - ✓ Courage to engage in critical analysis

- Year 1:
 - Unit 1: Advancing Academic Osteopathy
 - Unit 2: Personal and Professional Advancement
 - Unit 3: Expertise, Values & Evidence
- Year 2:
 - Unit 4: World Models of Osteopathy
 - Unit 5: Thesis Preparation & Advanced Research



Research Stage

- Years 3, 4 (& 5): Carry out research and present for final examination
 - 35-40,000 word thesis supported by:
 - Dissemination of Key Outcomes, e.g.
 - Paper for publication
 - Diagnostic or assessment tool
 - Case study
